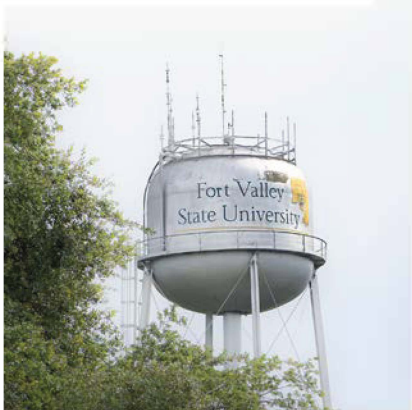

THE FOUNDATION'S MISSION



The Fort Valley State University Foundation, Inc. was established in 1972 with the specific mandate to serve as custodian of contributions from the private sector, alumni, friends, industries, and foundations; to receive, invest and administer funds; to act as trustee; and in general, to exercise the powers of a not-for-profit organization under the laws of the State of Georgia.

The purposes for which this corporation is organized are as follows:

1. To encourage, Solicit, receive, and administer gifts and bequest of property and funds for scientific, educational, and charitable purposes, all for the advancement of Fort Valley State University and its objectives and purposes and to that end to take and hold either absolutely or in trust for any of said objectives and purposes, funds and, property of all kinds, and subject only to any limitations or conditions imposed by law or the instrument under which received; to sell, lease, convey, and dispose of any such property and to invest and reinvest and proceeds and other funds, and to deal and expend the principal and income for any purposes herein authorized; to act as trustee; and, in general, to exercise any, all, and every power, including trust powers, which a corporation not for profit organized under the laws of Georgia for the foregoing purposes can be authorized to exercise.
2. To promote and support education; to provide:
 - (a) Funds which are not provided from public sources for use in the furtherance of education and welfare of Fort Valley State University, its faculty, and students;
 - (b) Funds to be used in attracting experienced, and outstanding instructors, educators, and scientists to such university;
 - (c) Educational facilities, including dormitories;
 - (d) Scholarships, and other activities subject to amendment.
3. To do and perform any acts and expend its funds in any manner which the board of directors shall determine will be beneficial to education and the university.
4. Upon specific approval of the Board of Directors or executive committee, to borrow search sums, on such terms and with such security, if any, as may be prescribed in such approval, but no trust assets may be pledged or committed in a manner that would violate the trust upon which held.
5. All of the assets and income of the foundation shall be used only for the purpose hereinabove set out, including the payment of expenses incidental thereto; and no part of its assets, income, funds, or property shall inure to the benefit of its members, directors, or officers, and no part of its activities shall be for the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the foundation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of statements), any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.
6. In the event of dissolution or other termination of the Foundation, title to all its assets shall vest in The Fort Valley State University or its successor, to be used exclusively for the purpose herein above set out, it being intended that no distribution or payment shall be made which will impair or destroy the tax exempt status of donations, contributions, legacies, bequests, or dues received by this Foundation, to the extent that such tax exempt status shall be allowed under any applicable laws or regulations.

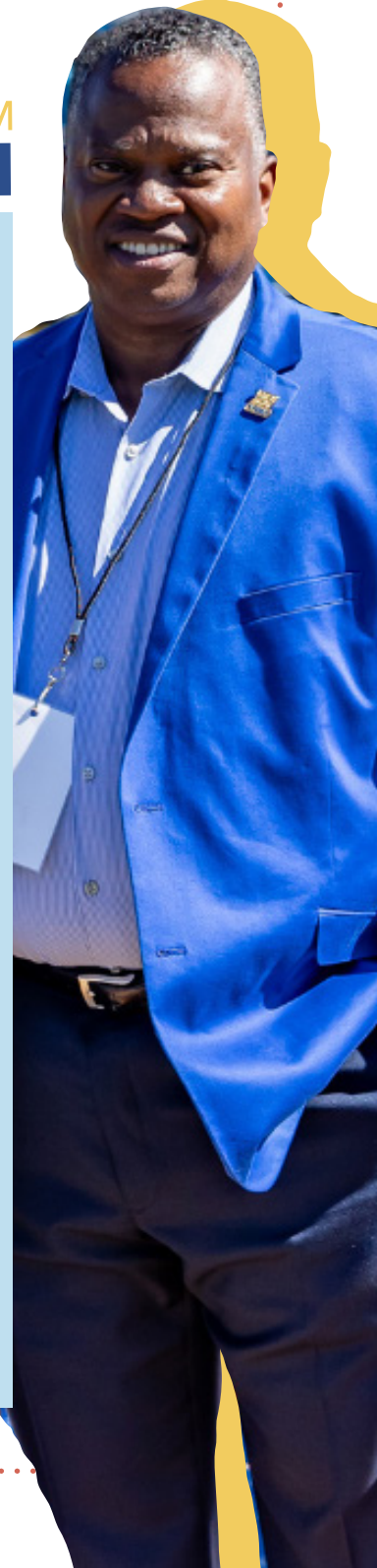

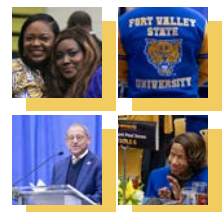

A History of Giving Back

The Jones Family's Legacy of Support for FVSU:

The \$1 million gift, made just last year in 2023, is only the latest chapter in the Jones family's extraordinary giving history. The family has made significant financial contributions to FVSU for over a decade, totaling more than \$1.7 million. In 2021, they donated \$700,000 to establish the Dr. Alma Jones Endowed Professorship of Social Justice, marking the first endowed position in the university's history.

Dr. Alma Jones, the eldest of the Jones siblings, was the first in her family to attend FVSU. Her achievements set the standard for her siblings, and she earned advanced degrees in medicine and public health. She has spent her career advocating for underserved populations, particularly in healthcare, and ensuring equitable access to medical services. The endowed professorship in her name seeks to continue this mission, supporting interdisciplinary research and education to address systemic inequities in society.

The Dr. Alma Jones Professorship has already had a profound impact three years after its establishment, fostering collaboration among faculty and students to address critical social justice issues. FVSU Department of Behavioral and Social Science Professor Komanduri S. Murty, Ph.D., continues to serve in his appointment to the Dr. Alma Jones Professorship in Social Justice, the university's first-ever endowed professorship.

"The Jones family's generosity represents a lasting investment in the future of our students and the communities we serve," said FVSU President Paul Jones. "Their commitment to social justice and educational excellence is transforming not just our campus but the lives of the students who will go on to make a difference in the world."

Cementing A Legacy: *The Christine and Willie C. Jones Amphitheater*

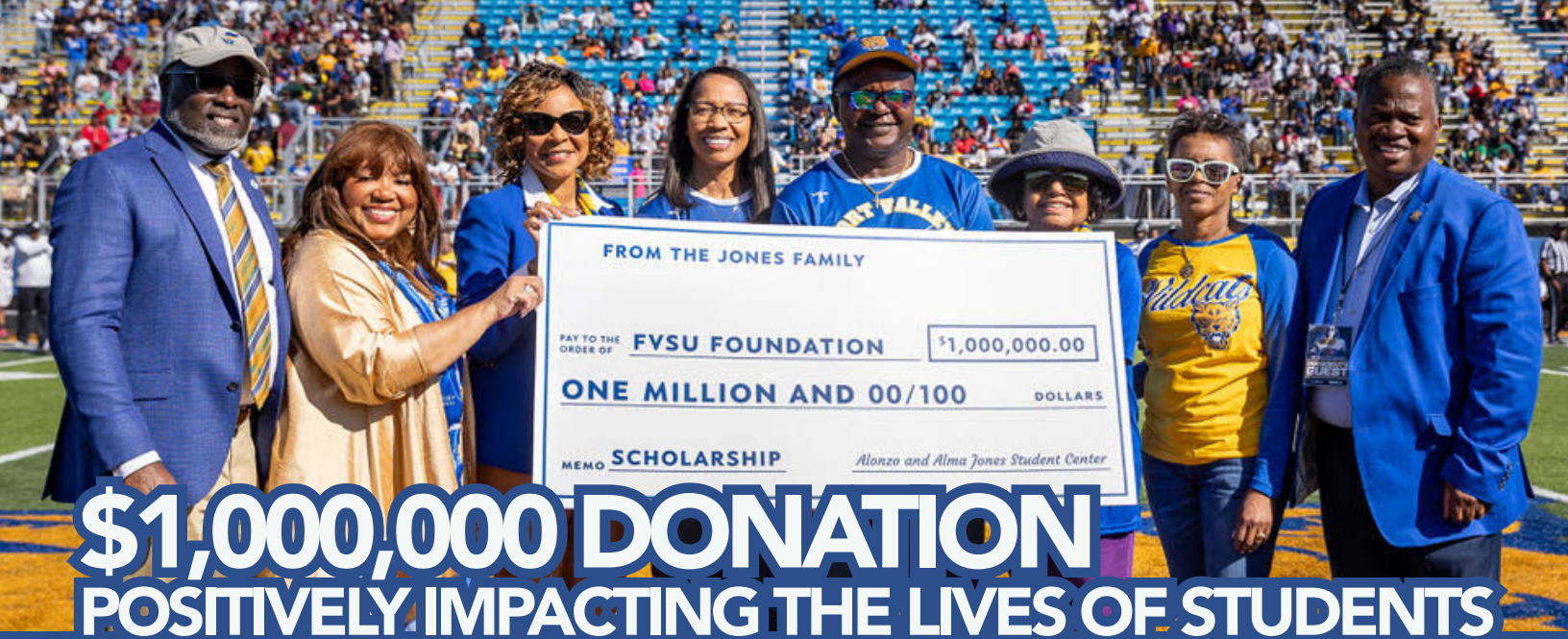

The Jones family's total contributions of over \$1.7 million have created a lasting impact that will benefit the university for years to come. Their unwavering commitment to FVSU, education, and social justice is a testament to the power of giving back and the difference alumni can make in shaping the future of an institution.

From the Christine and Willie C. Jones Amphitheater to the Alonzo and Alma Jones Student Center, the FVSU campus is a living tribute to a family whose generosity has transformed the university. And as FVSU continues to grow, the Jones family's legacy of service, success, and social responsibility remains at the heart of the university's mission.



Alumni and siblings Alonzo and Alma Jones donated \$1 million to the university, which is said to be the largest donation ever by living alumni. Now, the building is called Alonzo and Alma Jones Student Center, and it serves as a central hub for these students. Alonzo Jones graduated from Fort Valley in 1983 and Alma Jones in 1971 – both are now medical doctors. Officials at the university say their journey from students to successful doctors has inspired incoming, current and future students.

“They have a heart of service,” Fort Valley’s interim Vice President for Advancement Karen Wright said. **“After talking to Alma Jones, she wanted there to be a place where students would grow, they would collaborate with each other and their professors, and would also be used by the community.”** Lo and behold, their vision came true.

On Monday, the Jones family was there to unveil the newly named “Alonzo and Alma Student Center.” It is a central hub for Fort Valley’s Wildcats. As an alumni giving back, Alonzo Jones emphasized the potential he sees in the students at Fort Valley State.

“What we’re doing in Fort Valley is just trying to make sure that people that feel marginalized, that maybe feel unincluded, and maybe didn’t get the best high school education will still have ambitions, dreams, and aspirations about doing something bigger, to get an opportunity,” Jones said.

Overall, many students at Fort Valley feel inspired. Senior Anthony Thomas thinks the newly renovated and renamed building will have a large impact on the future of Fort Valley.

“It really brings a sense of reckoning to the student body to realize that something huge for us to happen in their lives and in the campuses life for this building to be named after them so it’s a sense of gratitude and then its an inspiration,” Thomas said.

The center has updated furniture and games for students to enjoy on their off days as well as conference rooms on the second floor for students to study with their fellow students.

FVSU, UGA College of Pharmacy Partner to Support Future Pharmacists

Fort Valley State University (FVSU) and the University of Georgia (UGA) College of Pharmacy signed an agreement allowing FVSU undergraduate chemistry students to have a streamlined approach for admission into UGA's Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) program.



FVSU's Homecoming 2023 "1895: The HITS" - Record Breaking Homecoming

The Wildcat football game against Morehouse drew record attendance, making it one of the most well-attended Homecoming games in recent history. Gate receipts from the football game showed an increase of 48%. This Homecoming witnessed an unprecedented achievement, with more than 300 season tickets sold. This marks the highest number of season ticket sales in FVSU's history, reflecting the passion and commitment of fans and supporters and the outstanding work of our Athletics staff.

Tailgating, another Homecoming tradition, saw an increase in participation. Current students, alumni, family, and friends came together to celebrate, enjoying good food and creating lasting memories. All tailgating spots for Homecoming 2023 were completely SOLD OUT with an 11% increase, and revenue from parking experienced a 2% increase. The vendor spots for Homecoming 2023 were in high demand and were SOLD OUT. Vending revenue soared by an impressive 31%.



FVSU Reopens The Vault in Honor of Thomas W. Dortch Jr.: A Resource Hub for Students

FVSU held a ribbon-cutting ceremony to reopen The Vault featuring Tommy's Closet. This celebration, led by President Paul Jones, Ph.D., honored the opening of a one-of-a-kind location in downtown Forty Valley where FVSU students can get professional clothes, toiletries and food. Tommy's Closet honors FVSU alum, the late Thomas W. Dortch Jr., President of Atlanta's 100 Black Men. Thomas W Dortch Jr. is recognized for his significant participation in youth mentoring, nonviolence, economic development, and education.



FVSU Fab Lab Grand Opening Sparks STEM Education Innovation

The grand opening celebrated the collaborative effort between Fort Valley State University, Chevron, and the Fab Foundation in introducing the innovative Fab Lab to the community. Attendees explored the newly established creative space, which was equipped with state-of-the-art tools, machinery, and resources designed to empower individuals to transform ideas into reality through digital fabrication, rapid prototyping, and hands-on learning.

The Fab Lab is a digital fabrication lab open to the FVSU community, K-12 students and educators, the public (including small businesses and entrepreneurs), and the Air Force community. The FVSU Fab Lab is funded by Chevron's HBCU Social Equity project and the Fab Foundation.

His legacy of kindness, wisdom, and mentorship lives on through the lives he touched, from his beloved wife, Hazel, and son, Vernard, to his grandson, VJ, and the countless students whose paths he illuminated with his guidance.

WAYS TO GIVE

Making a financial gift to the Fort Valley State University Foundation, Inc. ensures that the institution can fulfill its mission. Your gifts provide opportunities for students to pursue their career goals, then after matriculation, contribute to the global community. A contribution to the foundation also provides a special benefit to donors: tax benefits such as deductions for charitable contributions on income tax returns and capital gains tax savings when tax time approaches. Future estate tax savings also may result from the gift.

Donors determine how gifts are administered. When a contribution is not accompanied with specific instructions, it is classified as an unrestricted gift and used in the areas of greatest need at FVSU as determined by the board of directors, the officers of the foundation and the university president. To establish special funds, such as a scholarship in the name of a loved one, the foundation recommends that a meeting is scheduled between the donor and a foundation representative to determine how the funds will be administered and disbursed. Signed documentation that outlines the donor's wishes is strictly adhered to by the foundation.

Give Cash!

The easiest way to give to FVSU is through a cash contribution. Make a donation designated for the university's area of greatest current need. Contribute a large gift for a specific purpose, for scholarships, to enhance facilities, or to support a special activity.

Memorial Gift

Remember a loved one, living or deceased, by donating a gift in their name. Often, scholarships are established in memory of an individual to honor them.

Stocks, Bonds, and Other Assets

Stocks or other investments owned for at least one year that have increased in value become a substantial gift and can be donated at a low net cost to you. Appreciated assets can be ideal funding sources for charitable gifts that provide you (or someone you want to support) regular income for life.

Matching Gift

You or your spouse may work at a company that matches its employees' donations to higher education institutions. This program offers a great opportunity to double or triple your gift to the university. Each year, FVSU benefits from corporate contributions initiated by company employees or retirees.

Take a Capital Loss Yourself

If you own securities worth less now than when originally purchased, sell them and contribute the proceeds to the Fort Valley State University Foundation, Inc. Deduct the capital loss on your tax return. A tax break is not available to the foundation if the securities are donated directly to us.

Life Insurance

A contribution to the Fort Valley State University Foundation, Inc. from a life insurance policy can be made either by delivering an assigned ownership of the policy to the foundation, or by naming the foundation as the irrevocable Owner and beneficiary of the policy. The policy provides a definite, large, future gift at a small annual expense, and premiums are tax deductible. Another way to give is to change the beneficiary of an existing policy, if the present beneficiary no longer needs protection. The foundation can be named as the new beneficiary or co-beneficiary.

Personal Property

In most cases, a gift of tangible personal property, such as a painting, antiques, books, artifacts, or jewelry is considered a charitable deduction. The potential capital tax on the property's appreciation can be avoided.

Appreciated Property

It is often advantageous to contribute appreciated property rather than cash. Securities, homes, land, and other assets make ideal gifts. By donating gifts of appreciated property, you eliminate capital gains tax and receive a charitable deduction based on the full market value of the gift.

Outright Bequest

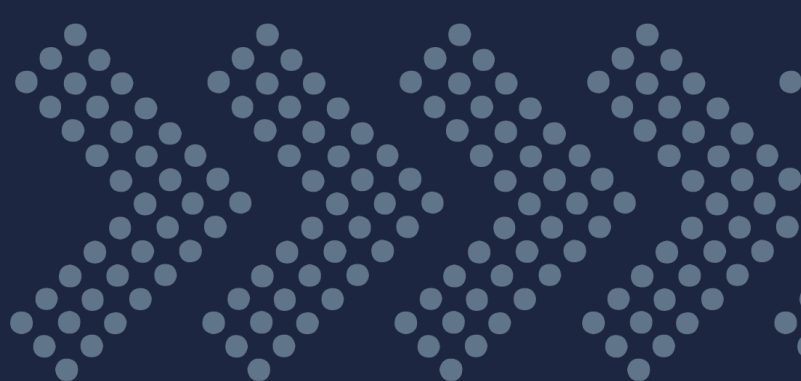
Name the Fort Valley State University Foundation, Inc. as a beneficiary in your will and make a gift of cash, investments, or property from your estate.

Individual Bequest

A residual bequest provides that after specific bequests are made to named individuals, Fort Valley State University receives the "residue" or the amount remaining in the estate.

Codicil

If you already have a valid, up-to-date will, you can have an attorney prepare a codicil to the will naming the university as a beneficiary without rewriting the entire document.
